Did You Know

- Jack McMullin, a 5th grader from Joseph Davies Elementary, was named Louisiana's Elementary Student of the Year
- The Chalmette High Cultural Arts Center hosted 54 shows this school year with over 18,900 audience members in attendance.
- Each tech student put in an average of 450 hours this year for all shows, giving over 2,200 performers the chance to shine.
- Students created over 50,000 pieces of art this year, highlighted by two district-wide art showcases.
- Maintenance upkeeps over 2 million square feet of indoor space annually and landscapes over 300 acres of grounds, fields, and courtyards.

Academics

- Universal, tuition-free pre-k 4 program.
- Students can complete a full year of college (30 hours) without ever leaving the CHS campus.
- 24 Posse scholars with an average scholarship of \$232K per student totaling over \$5.2 million.
- 30 CTE programs are among the best in the state, evidenced by the 805 industry-based credentials.
- Prostart team won the Louisiana Prostart Invitational for both Culinary and Management divisions for the 2nd year in a row.
- Seniors have taken 578 college-level courses, totaling 2,370 credit hours.
